

Appendix C: States codes

The following lists provide *states* codes for all state variables. Users familiar with the Mexican Migration Project (MMP) data set will notice that the same state codes used by the MMP for the US apply to this data set, with the exception of Puerto Rico itself. The MMP data base considers Puerto Rico as a US state and accordingly assigns to it a code in the 100s range. In this data set, Puerto Rico is considered separately from the United States and state codes for Puerto Rico correspond to its *municipios*.

MMP codes for Mexico were applied, although only two of them were necessary (listed below). For other countries, "state" refers to the country as a whole.

The lists are divided into four sections: generic codes; Puerto Rican states; U.S. states; and other countries.

Generic

For all geographical variables, there exists a set of commonly used codes:
